






The main sources of direct emissions are known, and the high level approach needed

Sources of BL's direct carbon emissions 2022/2023 (scope 1 & 2, and some transport scope 3)



- Gas St Pancras
- Gas BLCC
- Gas B.Spa Building 31
- Gas B.Spa Building 32
- Gas B.Spa other
- Electricity St Pancras
- Electricity Boston Spa
- Transport fleet, road & rail
- Transport flights
- Transport Link
- Fugitive emissions

The path to Net Zero Carbon for our <u>direct</u> carbon emissions:

- 1. Baseline and prioritise the main sources of direct emissions
- Lean reduce energy use through more efficient systems, fabric improvements, behaviour change
- Clean avoid fossil fuels by switching from gas/oil to electric solutions, such as heat pumps
- Green generate electricity on site (e.g. solar or wind) and procure from 100% renewable tariffs
- 5. Seen monitor, report, share
- Offset residual emissions in reputable ways (max 10% recommended by SBTI)



Reducing emissions at the BL since 2009/2010

Over the last decade and led by the Estates team, the Library has significantly reduced its carbon emissions and waste.

The Library has been working to the **Greening Government Commitments** which demonstrate how the Library is working to improve its environmental performance, measured against a 2009/10 baseline. In 2019/2020 ¹, for instance, we achieved targets for:

- Reducing greenhouse gas emissions – a 67% reduction on the 2009/2010 baseline
- Waste: 48% reduction from 2009/10 baseline
- Recycling: 66% of all waste

Objective 1:

Continue decarbonising our existing estate and embedding best practice in environmental performance in new buildings being constructed in this period

The Library has an existing overall goal to achieve net zero emissions by 2050 In this strategy period, we will be seeking to meet, and exceed these targets, by adapting our ways of working and our estates to radically reduce our emissions.

Objective 2:

Continue opening up the collection in new and interesting ways for people working on the ideas and solutions to the environmental challenges we face – from climate research to enabling sustainable business and enterprise, and engaging people through culture and learning, to increasing climate literacy and visibility of climate science.

As a national library and a repository of global knowledge that resides within a powerful network of libraries, research and cultural institutions, our opportunity to have a positive impact goes far beyond decarbonisation.



Green Libraries Partnership

- Established in 2022
- Our vision is of a better future for planet and people, empowered and supported by librarians and library workers
- Our mission is to place libraries at the heart of environmental change



Green Libraries Partnership - aims

- Discover and harness the existing work going on in libraries relating to Sustainability
- Build and support environmental understanding and action within libraries so they can play their full part in creating a better future for planet and people
- Enable libraries to work with their communities to continue to build environmental understanding and action
- Position libraries at the heart of local environmental programmes including those led by Local Authorities

Green Libraries Survey

- Early on in environmental journey
 - 27% at the very beginning
 - 56% making initial progress
- 85% follow local authority polices (relevance varies)
- 15% have their own environmental policy and plan
- 32% are developing their own environmental policy and plan
- 36% have staff with environmental roles and responsibilities
- 38% have some environmental training

Green Libraries Grant Fund – round 1

- 15 projects
- Examples:
- Wakefield Libraries Encouraging sustainable transport to our libraries
- Blackburn with Darwen Libraries Environmental activities at the Blackburn with Darwen Children's Literature Festival
- Eltham Libraries Wishing Well: Eltham Library's Community Garden

'The CILIP Green Libraries Fund enabled us to use the festival to raise awareness around what can be done to make a real and positive difference in our communities to support the green agenda. It explored themes of protecting nature and the environment in a variety of ways, in two libraries across five days, and reached over 2,000 children who visited with their schools and engaged online.'


